Ash Wednesday – the beginning of the Lenten season – is February 17th this year. That means it has been almost a year since the first Stay-at-Home order was issued. That didn't happen, and the slow recovery and vaccine rollout means we probably won't have church fully open by this Easter (April 4th). This year, however, we can be more prepared.

December results reflect a monthly gain in envelope income of \$675.00 compared to 2020 budget and an Investment gain of \$7,791.22. With Plate and Interest Income our total income for the month was a positive \$16,766.23. Expenses came in at (\$26,983.76) over budget for the month because of the PPP Loan being reclassified out of expenses and into a liability for year end. This left us with an overall loss of (\$10,217.53) for the month.

Our cash position as of 12/31/20 is \$371,712.37 in total cash assets, spread across our investment, Money Market, Operating Accounts and other investments. Our monthly expenses averaged \$10,124.31 a month and our income averaged \$8,229.99 a month for the year. We used \$35,500.00 of our investments to cover our short fall in our income for this year.

There recently was a fire in an apartment complex and they brought us all of the extra items that they collected. God keeps directing generous people to our food pantry needs.

Pastor and Ron Ziemer will be visiting the ATA Martial Arts School in February to meet students and parents as they bring food for their food drive which comes to Resurrection. They have been very good to us.

Our food pantry is open every Monday from 12:00 PM until 3:00 PM.
